The Three Rivers Levee Improvement Authority is assessing three alternatives to correct deficiencies on the existing left (east) levee of the Feather River and the left (south) levee of the Yuba River, a project which will require approval from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. As outlined by the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation (ACHP) in regulations implementing Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) (36 CFR Section 800.2(c)(2), federal agencies, are required to consult with Indian tribes that attach religious and traditional significance to historic properties that may be affected by an undertaking [Section 101(d)(6)(A)]. Moreover, historic properties of religious and cultural significance to Indian tribes may be eligible for listing in the National Register, and Section 101(d)(6)(B). On behalf of the Army Corps of Engineers we are bringing this project to your attention in order to solicit input and concerns

Three alternatives are being assessed for the project. The first would consist of strengthening the existing levees in areas which are highlighted on the attached maps. Alternatives 2 and 3 would consist of strengthening portions of the existing levee as well as replacement of a portion with a new levee, setback to the east, and depicted by the red and green alignments depicted on the attached maps. The Area of Potential Affects (APE) for this undertaking consists of the existing levee, 300 foot rights-of-way for the proposed new levees, lands between the existing levee and proposed realignments which would be subjected to seasonal flooding, and as yet to be defined borrow pit locations. Construction will involve excavations up to 10 meters in depth and grading using heavy equipment.

Preliminary records search information indicates the location of one site adjacent to the easternmost proposed levee realignment, and two others in the vicinity. All three sites are known to contain human remains within an occupational matrix, and indicate the potential for other cultural sensitive locales to be present.

We would appreciate any additional information you can provide regarding prehistoric, historic, or ethnographic Native American land use, and contemporary Native American values that may be present near or within the project area. We would also like to request a search of the NAHC Sacred Land files.

The Commission makes no recommendation or preference of a single individual, or group over another. This list should provide a starting place in locating areas of potential adverse impact within the proposed project area.
